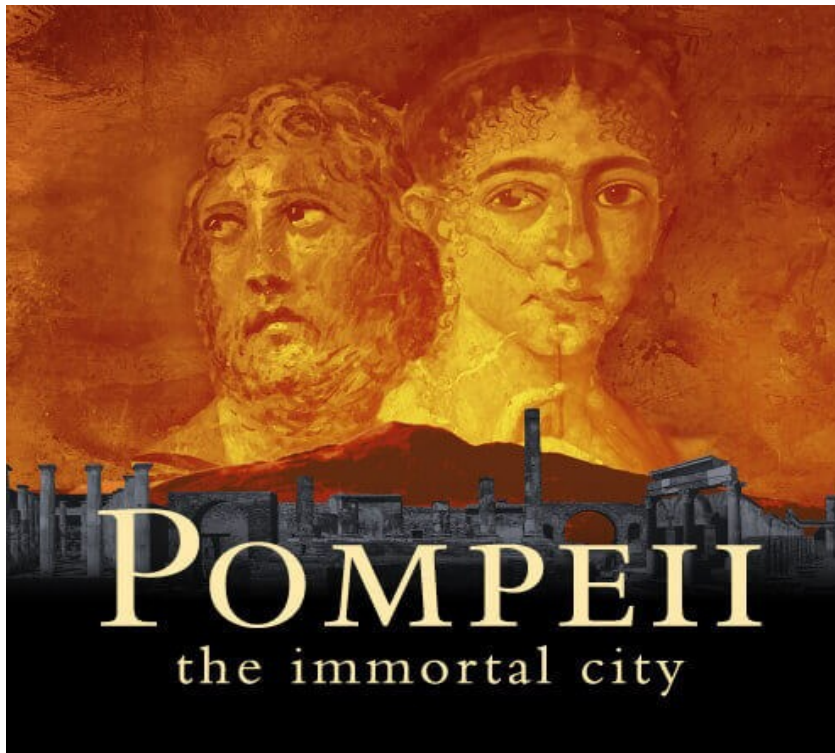
GENERAL MEETING FEE

CALL TO ORDER

President Ken Barnard called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m. at his home. All Board members were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Director/Events Chairman Jerry Roberts moved to approve the minutes of the October 13, 2020 Board of Directors meeting as read by Secretary Ron Bush (2nd – Director/Membership Chairman George Sepso; no vote).

TREASURER REPORT

Treasurer Jerry Danese presented the financial report for the period October 1-31, 2020. The starting balance was \$6,634.68. The chapter had receipts of \$611 and disbursements of \$128.48. The ending balance was \$7,117.20. The largest receipts were \$120 in meeting fees, \$250 in membership dues and \$220 in Christmas Dinner reservation fees. Jerry said \$25 in membership dues and \$20 in Christmas Dinner reservation fees had been received since November 1 giving us available funds of \$7,162.20 as of November 10.

VICE-PRESIDENT REPORT

Vice-President David Barnes said he had nothing new to report.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN REPORT

Director/Membership Chairman George Sepso reported our current membership is 81 as of today, November 10. Seven members are up for renewal in November.

EVENTS CHAIRMAN REPORT

Director/Events Chairman Jerry Roberts announced the events planned for December. The walking and bowling groups will meet on December 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29. Lunches will be on the 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd and 30th. The annual Christmas Dinner will be on December 5. The First Monday Social will be at Peach Valley Café on the 7th and the Board meeting will be on the 8th. The Evening at Stonewall on December 11 is canceled because of COVID-19. An outing to Winter Garden is scheduled for the 12th to have dinner and to see "Matilda the Musical." The General meeting on December 26 is canceled because of the holidays. Ken added he had also spoken with the manager of District Dive who got the okay from the general manager of Southern Nights and District Dive for us to use the theater for our meetings beginning in January 2021.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Member NJ Holtzman moved to approve the minutes of the September 26, 2020 General meeting as published in the November 2020 issue of *The Marquee*, the monthly newsletter of Prime Timers of Central Florida (2nd – Gary Snyder; no vote).

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Jerry Danese presented the financial report for the period September 26 to October 30, 2020. The club started with a balance of \$6,372.58. The club had receipts of \$561 and disbursements of \$118.90. The club ended the period with a balance of \$6,814.68. The largest receipts were \$325 in membership dues and \$120 in Christmas Dinner reservations.

- Announced that today's meeting would be our last in the Footlight Theatre as the Parliament House is closing. The business owners must vacate the property which was sold at a foreclosure auction earlier this year. Ken said the Board has not yet found another meeting venue as the news of the Parliament House's closing broke a couple of days before our meeting. The Parliament House was having a "last dance" on November 1. Ken added that the Board is open to suggestions for meeting locations.
- Reported that the 2020 Winter Raffle is being postponed until sometime in 2021 when conditions will hopefully be more conducive to having the raffle. He said some of the items will be switched to the gift raffle at the upcoming Christmas Dinner.
- Encouraged members to reserve their seat at the Christmas Dinner that will take place from 4 to 6 p.m. December 5 at the Azalea Lodge in Mead Botanical Garden in Winter Park. Reservations are \$10 for members in good standing, i.e. membership dues are current. Ken announced 25 members had already signed up. Reservations are due by the November General meeting on the 28th as we must give the caterers a headcount on November 30. **(Follow-up: On November 5, we learned that we must submit our headcount by November 27 so we will need reservations by the 26th.)** Seating at tables will be limited to 5 people and the tables will be 6 feet apart. Face masks will be required and members' temperatures will be checked on arrival. The meal will be a cafeteria-styled buffet. We will have a cash bar. In addition to the 50/50 cash raffle, we will have a raffle of several gifts and several gift cards.
- Asked members to remember our Good Deeds projects for Seniors First/Meals on Wheels and the children's home in Sanford. Seniors First has re-

- Distributed copies of future club events. In addition to the Christmas Dinner which will also celebrate our club's 25th anniversary on December 5, we will have an outing on December 12 to Winter Garden to have dinner and to see "Roald Dahl's Matilda the Musical"; an outing on January 6, 2021 to see the "Pompeii: The Immortal City" exhibit at the Orlando Science Center followed by lunch; an outing on February 6 to Winter Garden to have dinner and to see "Class Act" at the Garden Theatre; a potluck lunch on March 6 at the lake-front pavilion at Lakeshore Landings; and an outing on March 13 to Winter Garden to have dinner and to see "A Raisin in the Sun."
